Geoff Redgrave, PGA Director of Golf

Returning to the same area where he first picked up the game, Geoff Redgrave joined Wintergreen in July of 2006 after splitting recent golf seasons between The Ritz-Carlton, Jupiter Golf Club in Palm Beach, Fla., and the Tam-O-Shanter Club on Long Island, N.Y. Previously, Redgrave served 11 years at the renowned PGA National Resort & Spa in Palm Beach Gardens, Fla., where he was Director of Instruction.

A native of Bethesda, Md., Redgrave was collegiate standout – in baseball, rather than golf – at the University of Delaware and was a draft choice of the Cleveland Indians. In 1984, while pitching for the summer-league Waynesboro Generals, Redgrave joined some teammates at a driving range in Harrisonburg, about an hour from Wintergreen. It was the first time he ever hit golf balls.

Redgrave left baseball behind after graduating from Delaware in 1985 with degrees in political science and journalism. In less than seven years, he went from left-handed pitching prospect to certified member of the PGA. He competed on pro golf mini-tours and in numerous PGA section championships. His students have included numerous tour professionals, as well as participants in the highly respected Golf Digest School.

Frederick S. Biggers, CGCS, Head Resort Superintendent

Well respected in the golf industry, Fred Biggers has a wealth of experience collected over the past 30 years at major destination resorts, private courses, multi-course facilities and public courses – all of which he blends into the oversight of two golf courses at Wintergreen Resort.

Biggers has shown a special talent for preparing courses for tournament competition, meeting PGA Tour standards, as well as setting up for major amateur and junior national events throughout the Carolinas. He prepared Stoney Creek for the Canadian Tour's 2003 and 2004 Lewis Chitengwa Memorial Tournament.

He was selected for *Golfdom Magazine's* Superintendent Mentoring Award in 1993, one of four superintendents nationally chosen for their efforts to educate and mentor young golf course superintendents.

A member of the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America since 1976 (certified in 1986), Biggers has served on the board of the Carolinas Golf Course Superintendents Association, including a term as president in 1991. A member of the Virginia Turfgrass Foundation Board of Directors since 2000, Biggers was elected to a four-year term as president in 2005.

He helped establish the South Carolina Turfgrass Foundation in 1992, an organization that was successful in raising \$915,000 annually, through lobbying the state to fund Turfgrass Research at Clemson University from 1993 thru 2003. Currently Biggers is working on funding 2005 Virginia State Turfgrass Industry Survey, as well as raising funds to increase VTF endowment for future Turfgrass Research funding at Virginia Tech.

Biggers graduated from Clemson University (1978) with a degree in Turfgrass Management, minoring in Business Management. He earned his status as a Certified Golf Course Superintendent (CGCS) in 1986 from the Golf Course Superintendent Association of America.

Prior to joining the Wintergreen team in 1999, Biggers worked at Pinehurst Country Club, Alamance Country Club in Burlington, N.C. and Greenville Country Club in Greenville, S.C.

Biggers and his wife, Caroline, have a daughter, Claire, and son, Sam. The family is active in the Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church and Biggers also serves as a Boy Scout Leader.
