- James Madison, Father of the Constitution and the fourth President of the United States, was a planter and a scholar. He and wife Dolly Madison lived at [Montpelier](#) in nearby Orange, Va.
- Wintergreen's network of well-marked trails both on Wintergreen Mountain and in the Rockfish Valley below answer the call. The original Appalachian Trail traverses historic Wintergreen property, where you can learn about the interesting flora and fauna along its path.
- The Wintergreen Nature Foundation also holds a wealth of knowledge about Wintergreen Mountain, its heritage, amazing archeological finds and native peoples that crossed the mountains here.

Wintergreen is known for its two outstanding golf courses, Devils Knob Golf Club atop Wintergreen Mountain and Stoney Creek Golf Club in the picturesque Rockfish Valley.
